

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

Recent paleogenomics research revealed that interbreeding was common among early human species. However, little was known about when, where, and how often this hominin interbreeding took place. Using paleoanthropological evidence, genetic data, and supercomputer simulations of past climate, a team of international researchers has found that interglacial climates and corresponding shifts in vegetation created common habitats for Neanderthals and Denisovans, increasing their chances for interbreeding and gene flow in parts of Europe and Central Asia. Contemporary humans carry in their cells a small amount of DNA derived from Neanderthals and Denisovans. "Denny," a 90,000-year-old fossil individual, recently identified as the daughter of a Denisovan father and a Neanderthal mother, bears testimony to the possibility that interbreeding was quite common among early human species. But when, where, and at what frequency did this interbreeding take place? In a recent study published in Science on 10 August 2023, researchers from Korea and Italy have joined hands to answer this question. Using fossil data, supercomputer simulations of past climate, and insights obtained from genomic evidence, the team was able to identify habitat overlaps and contact hotspots of these early human species. Dr. Jiaoyang Ruan, Postdoctoral Researcher at IBS Center for Climate Physics (ICCP), South Korea, explains, "Little is known about when, where, and how frequently Neanderthals and Denisovans interbred throughout their shared history. As such, we tried to understand the potential for Neanderthal-Denisovan admixture using species distribution models that bring extensive fossil, archeological, and genetic data together with transient Coupled General Circulation Model simulations of global climate and biome."

"We show for the first time that cooperation is not all about you," says Rokšana. "Even if you have excellent mindreading abilities yourself, it will still be advantageous to cooperate with someone with similar abilities, so choose your cooperation partner wisely!"' These scores were compared with 2,700 college students nationally who took the TTCT in 2016. All submissions were scored by Scholastic Testing Service, which didn't know AI was involved. The results placed ChatGPT in an elite company for creativity. The AI application was in the top percentile for fluency -- the ability to generate a large volume of ideas -- and for originality -- the ability to come up with new ideas. The AI slipped a bit -- to the 97th percentile -- for flexibility, the ability to generate different types and categories of ideas. "For ChatGPT and GPT-4, we showed for the first time that it performs in the top 1% for originality," Guzik said. "That was new." He was gratified to note that some of his UM students also performed in the top 1%. However, ChatGPT outperformed the vast majority of college students nationally. Guzik tested the AI and his students during the spring semester. He was assisted in the work by Christian Gilde of UM Western and Christian Byrge of Vilnius University. 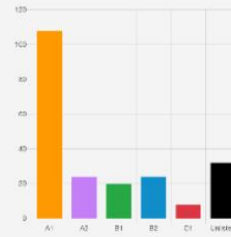

This may be because these pupils are especially useful in perceiving objects at the relatively short distances these animals tend to hunt.

After the liquid has been consumed and enters the intestines, "our body warms the liquid, and the carbon dioxide is released as gas and expands in our stomachs," explains Jen Messer, a nutrition consultant and registered dietitian. This effect can cause bloating, discomfort, a sensation of fullness, and most of all, a desire to burp. "This process takes center stage at the world burping competition where participants consume gallons of carbonated beverages to achieve their longest burp," Messer offers as one example. In addition to the effect carbonation has on the stomach, the high sugar content and artificial sweeteners in many sodas can lead to further digestive distress. "Excessive sugar intake can cause an osmotic shift of fluids and a rapid increase in blood sugar levels, which may lead to feelings of nausea, cramping, and diarrhea in some individuals," Messer explains. What's more, Jamie Bering, MD, a gastroenterologist at Mayo Clinic in Arizona, notes that many soda products "are high in acidity" from the flavoring additives that are used. "This can increase the acidity of the stomach and worsen symptoms of heartburn or abdominal discomfort," she says. It's also worth noting that in the case of soda brands infused with caffeine, the stimulant can increase contractions in one's digestive tract as well as the production of stomach acid. While this might not cause issues for most people, those with sensitive stomachs or "individuals with digestive issues should especially steer clear of these beverages," says Lisa Young, Ph.D., RDN, an adjunct professor of nutrition at New York University and author of "Finally Full, Finally Slim." Young adds that people with conditions such as gastritis, ulcers, and acid reflux should also "rethink their beverage options" because drinking soda may impact such ailments especially.

Objects at this specific distance are in geostationary orbit, meaning they revolve around Earth at the same rate the planet spins, thus appearing motionless in the sky. The counterweight itself could be anything, even a captured asteroid. From here, the tether could be released down through the atmosphere and connected to a base station on the planet's surface. To maximize centrifugal acceleration, this anchor point should be close to the Equator. By making the loading station a mobile ocean base, the entire system could be moved at will, allowing it to maneuver around extreme weather, and dodge debris and satellites in space.

If global warming accelerates, growing winter wave heights could have significant implications for flooding and erosion along California's coast, which is already threatened by accelerating sea-level rise. When waves reach shallow coastal waters, some of their energy is reflected back out to sea, Bromirski said. When this reflected wave energy collides with waves approaching the shoreline, their interaction creates a downward pressure signal that is converted into seismic energy at the seafloor. This seismic energy travels inland in the form of seismic waves that can be detected by seismographs. The strength of this seismic signal is directly related to wave height, which allowed him to calculate one from the other. In using this relationship to infer wave height, Bromirski had to filter out the "noise" of actual earthquakes, which he said is easier than it sounds because earthquakes are typically much shorter in duration than the ocean waves caused by storms. Bromirski developed this novel way to calculate wave heights out of necessity. Seeing patterns or trends in phenomena such as storm activity or big wave events associated with climate change requires many decades of data, and the buoys that directly measure wave heights along the California coast have only been collecting data since around 1980. Of particular interest to Bromirski were the decades prior to 1970 when global warming began a significant acceleration. If he could get his hands on wave records stretching back several decades before 1970, then he could assess the potential influence of climate change.
